

Social Media Feeds and Widgets

Setting Up

To get started, log into your UnionActive admin account and navigate to Settings Tab > Edit Website Settings.

Scroll down to the Social Network Settings section and enter the URL of your social media pages into the relevant fields. You can link to popular social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, and Google.

In this section you can also choose to display social network quick links which allow users to quickly share your content on their own social media.

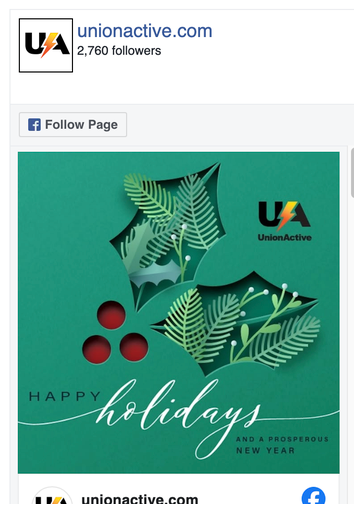
Once done, scroll to the bottom of the page and click Save or Update to apply your changes.

Entering your link in the Social Network Settings will automatically populate the feed in the the relevant social media mods.

Facebook Mod

The Facebook module in the UnionActive platform allows you to integrate your Facebook page directly into your website. This module enhances user engagement by providing visitors with easy access to your Facebook content and enables sharing capabilities.

Social Icons

The Social Icons module is a feature within the UnionActive platform that allows you to display social media icons on your website. These icons link to your organization's social media pages, making it easy for visitors to connect with you on various platforms.



The icons displayed directly relate to what you have included in your website settings- if you do not list a specific social media site the icon will not populate.

If you want a custom design for your social icons, you can create a new custom module that mimics the Social Icons module or has a unique design. Consider updating your website template if you want the social icons to appear in the header, especially for mobile views.

Twitter Widget

The Twitter widget on your website allows visitors to view your Twitter feed directly from your site. However, due to recent changes in Twitter's policy, the widget will only display tweets if the user is logged into their Twitter account. If they are not logged in, they will see a "nothing to display yet" message.

If you want to add a Twitter feed module instead of embedding directly into a page, scroll to the bottom of your homepage and click the **Add Custom Module** link. Follow the prompts to create a new module for your Twitter feed.

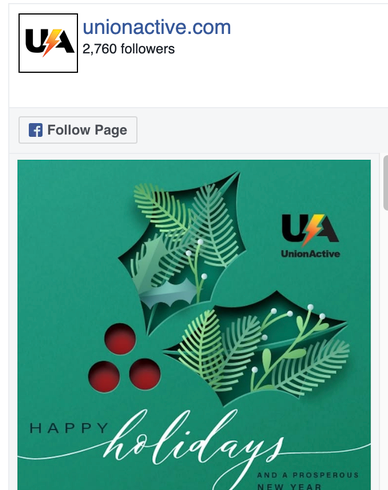
Social Bar



Social Tabs

The Social Tabs module is designed to enhance your website's social media integration by allowing you to display various social media feeds and links directly on your site.

Facebook Feed



Inserting Facebook, YouTube, and other embed code

You can insert the Facebook, YouTube, Twitter or any widget embed code into the website editor on any page, article, or module where you see the editor. Copy the code from the Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, or any site offering embed code, then edit the page, article, or module that you want to place the widget code into.

On the editor, place the cursor where you want the widget to appear, then click the embed code button, or click the HTML button, then paste the code into the new window, and then click Ok.

You can also click the Source button, and paste the code directly into the source code of the page.

To create a module, scroll to the bottom of the home page, and click the add custom module link, and follow the steps to create the module. You can also create a module in the left or right column of the site.
